<sup>6</sup> For while we were still helpless, at the right time Christ died for the ungodly. <sup>7</sup> (For rarely will anyone die for a righteous person, though for a good person perhaps someone might possibly dare to die.) <sup>8</sup> But God demonstrates his own love for us, in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us. <sup>9</sup> Much more then, because we have now been declared righteous by his blood, we will be saved through him from God's wrath. <sup>10</sup> For if while we were enemies we were reconciled to God through the death of his Son, how much more, since we have been reconciled, will we be saved by his life? <sup>11</sup> Not only this, but we also rejoice in God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have now received this reconciliation. (Romans 5:6-11 New English Translation)

Can you imagine that? God loves His enemies and actually died for them. You and I are God's enemies until we turn our heart over to Jesus. Let me encourage you to turn your life over to Jesus and experience God's love for you; a love so great that He showed it by dying for all His enemies.
